Congratulations Dany!



It is with great pleasure and pride the WFS congratulate Dany on her appointment as the interim Commissioner for the London Fire Brigade. This is an amazing achievement and a significant milestone, not only in the 150 years of LFB, but also in the UK Fire & Rescue Service. Dany joined the fire service in 1988, aged 18 after leaving college having studied for A levels and attained her first rank of promotion after serving 7 years as an operational fire-fighter. She has served at several fire stations in LFB and in different departments gaining a variety of experiences. She has been the Chair of Women in the Fire Service for a total of 11 years (2002-2008 and 2013 to present). Dany was awarded the Queen's Fire Service medal in the New Year's Honours list January 2004 and Public Servant of the Year in 2002. She was awarded the title of Fire 'Inspirational Woman of the year' in 2015. Highly regarded in the Fire & Rescue by her peers and colleagues, Dany has yet again shown that the glass ceiling can be

shattered. All in WFS wish her the very best in her role and we look forward to being able to congratulate her in person during the year.

Dany follows the appointment of Becci Bryant in 2016 as Chief Fire Officer in Staffordshire and also in the coming months, Dawn Whittaker as acting Chief Fire Officer in East Sussex. Prior to this there have been 4 female Chief Executives, Cheryl Rolph (2000-2001), Susan Johnson (2005-2015), Anne Millington (2011 and still in post) and Joy Smith (2014-2015). There have also been 2 women Chief Executives at the Fire Service College, Gill Newton (2004-2008) and Sally Sheen (2008-2009).

Our 17th National Training & Development weekend will be held on 16-18 June 2017 hosted by the Fire Service College. This is a great opportunity for both operational and sup-



port delegates to utilise the state of the art training facilities.
