Women's wellbeing week, broad target market roughly for around 40-60 age bracket to increase fitness level, mental resilience or general well-being Menopause, changes physically. Support and guidance on how they can help with transition This programme involves physiotherapists, Exercise therapists, health and wellbeing practitioners and psychologist, quite a broad range of professions Week running at Jubilee House, 30 June – 5 July, hoping to do another one towards the winter time. KS – Insurance KS informed the committee that WFS have met with Insurers to review what is covered on the annual insurance. This was at the request of the Insurance	

Company. It became evident WFS need to tighten up on activities running in regions and the responsibility, liability/risk that could be involved. The Training and Development Event was also not sufficiently covered for all the activities involved. The Insurance company made it very clear that any event held under the umbrella of 'WFS' needs to be covered under their own/or individual insurance. Separate insurance is now in place for the Training and Development Event. This needs to be made clear in all communications on events. Daisy Byron, has already provided communications for Mam Tor informing that they require their own individual insurance.
