We have recently produced a regional event pack available to regional reps organising events. The guide is designed to help guide and bring consistency to all events.

We have continued our work with Women to Work who deliver the Women's Development Programmes. This is a fire service specific programme delivered over 3 half-day sessions. If you are interested, please do have a look on the website.

We continue to work with the NFCC sharing our experiences and feedback on conferences and toolkits, and contribute to the lived experience advocacy forum.

We have received an invite to attend a ministerial advisory group specifically looking at reform within the sector and there have been two recently introduced task and finish groups - culture and inclusion and college of fire and continue to have an Influence and voice at national level across a number of areas.
